GARDEN ACTIVITIES FOR JUNE/JULY

Prepared by the Master Gardeners of Ottawa-Carleton – suggestions for July/August:

July

- Raise mower height of cutting blade
- Shallow hoe garden regularly, if not mulched
- Hand pick weeds that have made it through the mulch
- Check for aphids on roses, nasturtiums etc. (A strong spray from a hose should remove them)
- Prune climbing roses

August

- Monitor lawn for grubs
- Take notes and photos of your garden for future planning
- Continue to weed and control pest problems

REPORT ON THE JUNE FIELD TRIP SATURDAY JUNE 11

At our May monthly meeting, the GGG members were treated to a presentation by Edythe Falconer on roses, specifically the “Roses of the Central Experimental Farm” (CEF) and as part two of this treat, our 2011 Field Trip took us to the CEF to learn more about the roses from Edythe (second from the right in the photograph). During the field trip, we learned that pruning was an ongoing task and that this year the CEF Roses were subject to some new challenges, specifically insect pests. Edythe showed us how some of these pests bore into the flowers in the bud stage and effectively destroy that flower.



The sixteen GGG members who participated in the field trip enjoyed Edythe's hands on insight into the challenges and rewards of growing roses here in the Ottawa area. The

experience was enjoyed by those present, and we would like to thank Edythe for her time spent with us on one of the first really 'hot' days of the late spring.
